

Research and Youth Ministry

Several people and organizations have been doing youth ministry research over the last several years. Their hope has been to identify what patterns, habits, and experiences youth have that correlate with continuing to live and identify as a disciple of Jesus into adulthood.

Here are the strongest correlations:

- -- Parents attended worship with them regularly and a high importance on faith
- -- The teen had expressed that faith was very important
- -- The teen had several personal religious experiences
- -- The teen frequently prays and reads scripture
- -- The teen had expressed little to no doubts about their religious beliefs
- -- Teen has many adults in religious congregation to turn to for help and support



What is Confirmation?

"Confirmation is a public rite preceded by a period of instruction designed to help baptized Christians identify with the life and mission of the Christian community." -- Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation

Confirmation prepares our students by

- → establishing their Identity as children of God, as members of a greater Christian community, and as disciples of Jesus, which includes good spiritual habits.
- → **teaching** them the doctrine of the Lutheran Church
- → **empowering** them to engage in service and mission in the church and community

Confirmation is NOT

- -- A graduation
- -- Just an academic exercise





Monthly Opportunities

We strive to have at least one event a month for Junior High. The events/activities will vary from month to month. Examples of events:

- * Spiritual retreats

Summer Opportunities

Going Beyond Confirmation

Weekly Opportunities:

Sunday Morning Community Hour at 10:30am includes Bible Study, Fellowship, & Service

Confirmation Classes — Wednesdays at 6:30 pm.

This night includes:

- -- Fellowship Games
- -- Confirmation Teaching
- -- Small group discussion
- -- Occasional service activities



What is the process?

Confirmation is a 3 year process that will occur during most students' 6th to 8th grade years.

Key Learning Opportunities

Weekly instruction
With Small Group Discussion

Memory work

Appropriate Assessments/Tests

Final Culmination Interview (8th grade year)

Class Information

- -- Classes start on Sept 7th with a meal at 6 pm, and continue until 7:45 pm each Wednesday.
- -- Class time includes lecture time, small group discussions, and group building activities
- -- <u>6th Grade Focus</u> Bible, 1-3 Commandments and the 1st Article of the Apostles Creed
- -- <u>7th Grade Focus</u> Lord's Prayer, Commandments 4-10, and 2nd Article of Apostles Creed
- -- <u>8th Grade Focus</u> 3rd Article of the Apostles Creed, Baptism, and The Lord's Supper



For Students

Students are expected to:

- -- be there at every confirmation class or to provide reasonable notice of an absence.
- -- worship on Sunday mornings and attend Bible study regularly - this is the heartbeat of a Christian's life and the lifeblood of a healthy community of faith.
- -- participate, as you are able, in the overall youth ministry.
- Community is critical to our life and faith as Christians. We are made and designed for community and not meant to be isolated to ourselves.
- -- laugh at all jokes, even if the they are spectacularly groan-worthy "dad jokes."

Materials

The church will provide the items below as part of the confirmation process (if you don't already have them). Again, each student is responsible for bringing these to class each week.

- -- Bible
- -- Luther's Small Catechism
- -- Pen/Pencil
- -- Paper
- -- Notebook or Binder for notes

PLEASE NOTE

We desire for every student participating in Confirmation to have <u>their own</u> Bible and Small Catechism. We would prefer them to **not** use an older sibling, parent's, or family member's Bible or Small Catechism.

If you do not have one or have misplaced yours, please talk with Nathan about getting a new one.



Cost

Rather than ask parents to pay for the various expenses of confirmation throughout the year, we are presenting the combined expenses at the beginning. **The cost for Confirmation is \$50.**

This cost includes the following:

- -- Catechism (and Bible if needed)
- -- Confirmation Sunday Costs
- -- Crossing Retreat with High School

PLEASE NOTE

We do <u>NOT</u> want Confirmation expenses to keep people from participating in Confirmation.

If cost is a concern, please talk with Nathan or one of the Pastors.


You can also contact Nathan if you would like to consider sponsoring with a partial or full scholarship for another student.



- -- bring a Bible and Small Catechism every week. We ask that no confirmation student use a Bible on their cell phone or tablet because the multi-functional use of these devices often proves to be a powerful distraction.
- -- bring paper and pen to class, take notes, and engage in discussion.
- -- acolyte as part of their commitment to God and His church. If there is a legitimate reason that they cannot acolyte (or if they set Pastor Ben's beard on fire) then we will work with the family to discover another way to serve in the church.

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

For the Parents

The scriptures inform us that you are the primary spiritual care-takers of your children. This is backed up by statistics and research that points to you being the most influential people in the lives of your children. We can't do youth ministry without you, and we wouldn't want to anyway! We strive to encourage and partner with you as parents in this confirmation journey.

Parents are expected to:

- model the life and mission of the Christian Community, and model what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.
- -- embrace the struggle and set appropriate priorities.
- -- encourage, pray for, and help your students throughout the Confirmation process, which includes, but is not limited to, having spiritual conversations at home.



For the Teachers & Guides

The expectations we have for ourselves are very similar to the ones we have for you!

Teachers & Guides are expected to:

- -- prepare and teach faithfully to the Word of God
- -- model the life and mission of the Christian Community, and model what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.
- -- encourage, pray for, and help the students and parents throughout the Confirmation process.
- -- care beyond the classroom
- -- partner with you and walk along side you throughout the Confirmation process and beyond.
- -- make the occasional "Dad Joke" that is worthy of a good eye roll and/or groan.
